From the Chaplain

Of the eight 'Goals' of St Paul's College (which can be found on the College website on the page "Motto, Mission and Goals") the very first Goal is "to expose students to the Christian message." It is a privilege to be able to be a part of that work, especially in the Christian message which is shared in our daily Assembly as well as in the regular worship of the Chapel. (Not to mention through our RS Classes, Christian Union and in many other ways). For some boys, that exposure may lead to a desire to learn more about the Christian faith and even to become a Christian.

In a recent Assembly I spoke about **Baptism**, the rite of admission into the Church. I also invited any boy (and member of staff) who is interested in exploring the possibility of Baptism to speak to me, as I hope to start a Baptism preparation class soon. Even if a student attends such classes and then decides not to go ahead with Baptism, I hope that there will have been a process of learning, thinking and reasoning which will have taken place (all skills which are vital in our world today). I also hope that it will be part of the process of instilling in the boys of St Paul's a sense of respect for all people, regardless of faith. In fact there is nothing at all to be ashamed about in attending such classes and then not being baptised. It shows that the person has thought seriously about what is involved.

From the Music Office

Choral singing has been a great tradition in St. Paul's College. In order to carry on with this good tradition,

the Music Department has never stopped providing platforms to foster our students in choral singing.

At the beginning of this new term, the Music Department introduced a concert program to our students to arouse their interests. On 11th September, Mr. Felix Yeung and a renowned countertenor from England, Mr. lestyn Davies came to our school to give a pre-concert talk to our Form 1 students. Felix is one of our alumni with outstanding musical achievement. He is now the Provincial Music Director of Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui and also the Music Director of the well-known choir, Die Konzertisten. About 190 Form 1 students attended their concert at the Grand Hall in the University of Hong Kong on 14th September, where





they played

Pergolesi's Stabat Mater, Faure's Requiem and Bernstein's Chister Psalms. This programme helped to broaden their horizon in music appreciation.

The Music Department also invited another alumnus, Mr. Stephen Lam and his choir- the Pointe Singers, to perform in two music assemblies on 19th September. Mr. Stephen Lam is now studying conducting in Vienna and has been a very active young musician in Hong Kong. Under the baton of

Stephen, his choir performed two pieces of

music, a folk song and an Indian song rearranged for A cappella singing at the assemblies. Their performance was well received by the students and teachers.
