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Principal's Message



We thought 2017-2018 would be a quieter year after our 165th anniversary celebrations, but it has turned out to be just as eventful.

We are the champions!

At the time of writing this newsletter, the most talked about and exciting news in SPC is not the royal marriage, but rather our Chinese debate team being crowned champion in the grand final of the 33rd Hong Kong Sing Tao Inter-School Debating Competition, the victory being the fruit of the team's labours after three years of toil and sweat. Led by our alumnus-teacher Mr. Tse Shing Ngat, ably assisted in coaching by a number of alumni, and supported by the whole St. Paul's College and St. Paul's College Primary School community, our students brilliantly delivered this crowning achievement. We are proud to say that this achievement is entirely made in and by the staff and students and alumni of St. Paul's College.

Those who have been following the development of the College will know that we are embarking on an ambitious Campus Enhancement Project that will give SPC students the best resources and facilities now and in the future. It has been well over 50 years since SPC moved to Bonham Road. Although there have been many changes since then, our facilities have really not changed greatly since the buildings were erected in the 1960s. It is time for us to transition to a different mode of learning incorporating smart technology for smart students. The first phase of enlarging and upgrading all

our classrooms has already started and we envisage that the entire project, costing approximately \$400M, will be completed in four phases. We hope the whole SPC community (students and alumni, teachers both past and present, parents and friends of the College) will partner with us and assist us financially to make the project possible. Attached with the News from St. Paul's is a donation form and we appeal to all alumni to give generously so that next generations of Paulines can enjoy better resources and facilities.

2017-2018 is also significant in that we have entered the third year of the school development cycle. Throughout this year, we have been doing a lot of evaluation and planning in preparation for a school development plan for 2018-2021. This process has now been finalised. This is certainly an important document as it sets out the direction that the College will take in the next three years. Although I cannot personally explain the plan in detail to all alumni, I hope to give a quick preview here of the targets that we set for ourselves for 2018-2021:

1. Equip teachers with a wider repertoire of teaching strategies
2. Foster autonomy in learning
3. Develop a collaborative culture
4. Create an atmosphere of innovation
5. Incorporate the 5Cs (Collaboration, Communication, Creativity, Critical thinking and Citizenship) into the curriculum
6. Promote healthy living among students and teachers
7. Work towards a caring and compassionate SPC community

As we say goodbye to 2017-2018, I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the dedicated teachers for another year of hard work, and to salute our alumni for their unwavering support. We are all looking forward to another exciting year ahead as we set new goals and scale new heights!

St. Paul's students have been excelling in various areas. Besides outstanding academic performance, many of our students are talented musicians, sportsmen, actors and leaders. We are proud of their achievements. Below are the highlights of the year.

Chinese debate team crowned champion at inter-school debating competition

Our Chinese debate team was crowned champion in the grand final of the 33rd Hong Kong Sing Tao Inter-School Debating Competition.

Our Junior Drama Team took first prize and Best Script award in the "Stories on Stage" Drama Competition 2018.

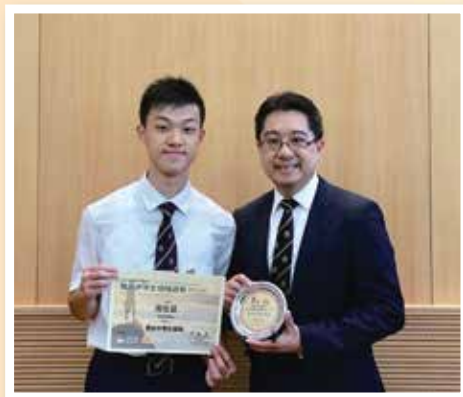
Luzern Chow awarded for his all-round performance

Luzern Chow (5F) was selected as one of the top 10 Hong Kong Outstanding Teens in the biannual election organised by the Hong Kong Playground Association in collaboration with the Outstanding Young Persons' Association and the Outstanding Teens Association.



Luzern was awarded a certificate and a trophy by Mr. Matthew Cheung Kin-Chung, Chief Secretary for Administration, HKSAR.

He also won the Outstanding Leaders Award, presented by the Hok Yau Club Potential Development Centre. It is as much a leadership skills contest as a rigorous training programme which involves adventure training, social immersion workshops and a week-long study excursion to Northeast China. Having completed the programme with excellent results, Luzern successfully came through three rounds of interviews and was selected as one of the winners.

Below is the passage he wrote for the Top 10 Hong Kong Outstanding Teens Award.

一個59分的故事

一切均由59分開始。

從小學至初中，數學都是我的「敵人」。中二期終考試時，數學科竟低至59分！我知道不可以再漠視這「敵人」，我不甘心一直被打敗！我要改變！

與家人商討後，找了一位補習老師針對性地處理我的問題。老師非常嚴厲，密集式訓練我解題的能力，加快我計算的速度，每天我都做不同類型的題目，不覺間已做了十多本練習題。經過一輪「地獄式」訓練，中三的期中試時，我竟然拿了99分，是全級第二的成績！頒獎台上，校長頒給我的獎狀，端在手裏有千斤重，我終於戰勝了自己，戰勝了「敵人」！

現在，數學已變成了我的好友。這段經歷令我明白「世上無難事，只怕有心人」。堅定的決心，不屈不撓的意志，加上旁人的幫助，真的可以排除萬難！更重要的是這段經歷啟發了我，眼見許多小學生也很討厭數學，但卻沒能像我那麼幸運，家中有能力負擔補習費。所以，我向老師提出和明愛合辦免費數學補習班給小五學生，希望以我親身的經歷去幫助這些貧苦小孩，幫助他們爭取好成績，有更大機會向上流動。幸運地，學校的老師和明愛莫張瑞勤社區中心均十分支持我的計劃，為我提供場地和物資援助，更幫我找到了有需要的小朋友。

在過去半年，我從籌劃、實行、審視中都獲益良多，從策劃整個項目，為小學生準備教材，要令他們對數學產生興趣，更親自游說同學們擔任義務導師。起初，同學們都不太有興趣，很多同學都不願意花上一一年時間在補習服務上，大家都忙於補習和課外活動。於是不斷將計劃改良，包括在學校的會議之中直接向同學介紹這計劃背後的意義，找出幾位志同道合的同學作為計劃核心成員，安排詳盡的當值表，使同學清晰知道他們要負責的課堂節數，並提供適當的獎勵等。最終，計劃成功得到40多位同學支持。而這個為期一年的補習服務計劃也順利推行至今，大家都風雨不改地堅持每逢周五替小孩補習。

在進行了半年的補習服務後，我自己也獲益良多。除了親身接觸到社會不同階層小童的學習環境和狀況外，看著他們一天比一天進步，也從他們的笑聲中，看到他們對學習的興趣和願意挑戰新事物，我常常被他們的好奇心和熱誠打動。原來我們不但解決了他們數學上的難題，更加提升了他們的學習興趣和自信心。

「未經一番寒徹骨，哪得梅花撲鼻香」，困難往往是一個考驗，若不邁出第一步，踏出自己的舒適圈，和它正面交鋒，永遠只會被困難打敗，更無法體會克服困難後所帶來的喜悅及成長。我很感謝曾經拿過59分的經歷，更慶幸自己沒有自此一蹶不振，這段經歷反而成就了今天的我！我的夢想是在貧困的社區招募更多中學生，如深水埗、觀塘等，開辦類似的免費補習班或更多樣化的服務，令更多小孩和有需要的人受惠。

夢想不是說出來的，而是做出來的，而要做出來就應當仁不讓！希望我能感染更多年青人，一同成就更多由59到99分的故事！

It is a fruitful year for SPC athletes. The B and C grade table-tennis team came second in the Inter-school Table-tennis Competition. They also secured the second place overall while the football teams have clinched the overall Division 2 title in the Inter-school Football Championships. Thanks to the all-out effort and dedication of our three football teams, including our B-grade champion, both the football team and table-tennis team will be promoted to Division 1 for the next season. Moreover, the hockey team also performed marvelously. They only lost to the South Island School in the final match and placed second. They will compete with other renowned schools in top division next year as well. Lastly, the badminton team continued to shine on the badminton court. The C grade team became the champion after beating Queen's College in the final.

On behalf of all the athletes, the College would like to express our sincere gratitude to Yau Kai Ching, Quentin, who came back to school to provide physio treatment and consultation to our athletes every week.

Event Highlights

Activity Week 2018

Our first Activity Week, initiated by the Other Learning Experiences Team, was held from 23rd to 27th April. All F.1 to F.4 students had the opportunity to learn beyond the classroom and experienced more than 80 different activities, including Community Experiences, Arts, Sports and STEM programmes. Learning knows no boundaries, nearly a hundred students participated in overseas programmes to New Zealand, Taipei, Vietnam, Shanghai and Japan.

The school collaborated with many organizations to provide diverse learning experiences for our students. Through Junior Achievement Hong Kong, we invited plenty SME owners to share their valuable views and experiences on entrepreneurship. More than 30 officers from the Fire Services Department sacrificed their off-duty time to teach all our F.3 students how to perform CPR. Southern Film Company turned our school hall into a cinema, where our students enjoyed the movie "Weeds on Fire" (點五步) adapted from a true story of a Hong Kong baseball team, followed by a sharing session by the film director. All these had broadened the horizons of our students.

With the collaboration of the Integrated Humanities, Integrated Science, Music, Physical Education and Visual Arts Departments, and the STEM and Other Learning Experiences Team, a wide array of educational activities were conducted for our students on 26th April. Students had made online applications for these Self-enrolled Programmes through the OLE online platform, created by Mr. W. W. Mak. Among these activities, one group of students went inbound to Foshan, China to learn ceramics.

The Activity Week also culminated with the Student-led Programme, where F.2 and F.3 students gained a variety of learning experiences. It all started last December when each class formed an organizing committee and designed a class-based activity under the guidance of their Form teachers and the OLE Team. Through active participation in the organization of the activities, students had developed communication, collaboration and leadership skills. The programmes organized by our students included Visit to Water Sewage, Bakery Class, Beach Cleaning, Archery Tag and Kin-ball.

The Activity Week was well-received by our students and parents and its success lay upon the support from all stakeholders of our school.

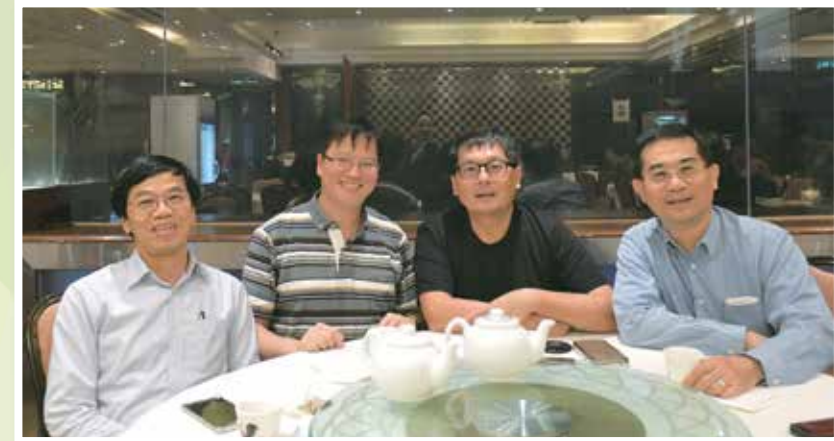

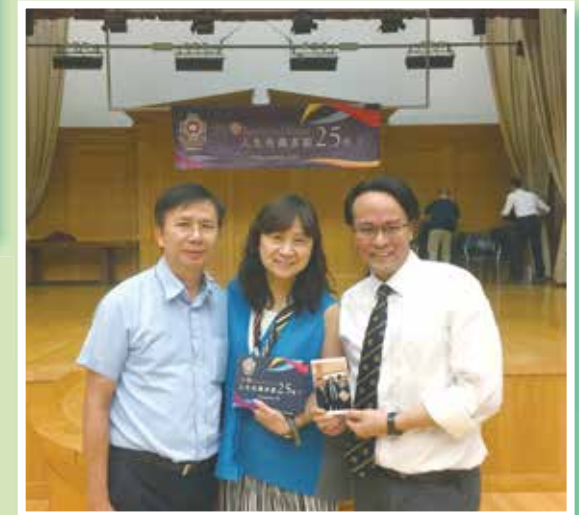
Class of 1991

I expected a quiet year after the 165th Anniversary celebrations which ended with the festive Anniversary Carnival sponsored by the Foundation. Things did not go that way! The Foundation was first asked to help fund the feasibility study of the Campus Enhancement Project which subsequently received the green light from the School Council. The Foundation is now given the task of raising funds to make it happen!

Our campus was built between the late fifties and the sixties and this project would probably be another major change in half a century. We have plans to provide better facilities for Music and Art as well as the sciences to fit in with the requirements of the STEM which has also been re-named STEAM to include the Arts. I hope you will all read through the letter from the Principal to learn more about the project.

To me, a former teacher of the College, this project will bring a lot of improvement in terms of space, but that is not the main attraction. The change would bring the staff rooms back from the 9th and 10th floor down to where the students are. It will allow better interaction among students and between students and teacher with the increased space. It will allow us to meet the challenges of the new modes of teaching and learning.

The expansion of the classroom space means an invasion of the sacred space for our boys – the playground. We must work hard to raise funds, enough to complete all four phases of the project so that we can raise the sports grounds to include an Indoor Sports Hall and an outdoor playground. Resources will also be devoted to equip the gym and the swimming pool which will be covered and heated. I sincerely hope that all of the above and a lot more can be done. This would require the concerted effort of the SPC family, alumni, parents, students and teachers. The contribution of each and every one of them would count towards the success of the project.

The St. Paul's College Foundation is celebrating its 10th Anniversary. This project will be an important milestone in the Foundation history. I am delighted to report that an alumnus, who prefers to remain anonymous, has pledged a matching fund of HKD Thirty Million for the year 2018. I hope this book reaches you in time to make your donation twice as powerful.

A donors' wall will be created to have the names engraved. If any class, or group of alumni, wants their names to appear in a cluster, please register early. For the first time in our College history, rooms can be named so as to generate sufficient funds for this ambitious project. Latest Updates

April 2018

The setting up of bamboo scaffolding with dust screen and hoarding board, including a screen, has been completed. A water barrier has also been installed.
