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Principal's Message



Celebrate our Heritage, Build Our Future

Just when we thought the pandemic was behind us, the virus flare-ups during the fifth wave of the pandemic caught us all off guard. The gradual return to normalcy which we saw at the beginning of the academic year suddenly took an ugly u-turn. Schools in Hong Kong were asked to revert once again to an online mode of teaching and eventually to have a “summer break” in March, much to the disappointment of both students and teachers.

Our 170th anniversary celebrations were unfortunately scheduled to take place in the midst of seemingly unremitting struggles against the many variants of Covid-19 and the resulting restrictions. With such uncertainties during this period, the decision whether to make preparations for our 170th anniversary events or to postpone them was not always an easy one. Nonetheless, we soldiered on as a way to teach our students the need to forge ahead in the face of adversity. Even if an event had to be eventually postponed, at least students had the opportunity to practise and learn how to organise one.

Thanks to the determination and hard work of everyone, I am happy to say that we managed to pull off quite a number of celebration events despite the unprecedented challenges presented by the pandemic. Many of our 170th anniversary celebrations were organised around the theme “Celebrate our Heritage, Build our Future”. As the oldest school in Hong Kong with 170 years of history, we are of course proud of our heritage and tradition. The 170th Anniversary Concert, “Paul - Our St Paul’s”, for example, is a celebration of our Christian tradition. The musical retraces the significant events in the life of Saint Paul for students and members of the College community to commit themselves anew to the Christian values on which the College was founded. Similarly, the newly installed mosaic murals in the College campus, which was donated to us by an alumnus, also feature the Apostle Paul dedicating his life to the work of Christ (Romans 12:1-2).

Our history exhibition, on the other hand, is a celebration of our long and illustrious history. Originally scheduled to be held during Easter at the Central Market, the history exhibition has to be postponed to the Easter of 2023 because of the recent tightening of social distancing measures.

While our history and tradition are certainly worth celebrating, we do not want to focus only on the past. We honour our past because there is always something that we can learn from it. 170 years ago when Hong Kong was just a remote outpost of the British Empire, St. Paul’s College was a pioneer in providing education to the young people of Hong Kong based on Christian principles. 170 years later, the world has drastically changed but the same pioneering spirit remains in St. Paul’s College to prepare students to embrace the brave new world of artificial intelligence, robotics, gene editing and the Internet of Things (IoT). The focal point of the 170th anniversary seminar series, which was held from March to May, is on how we can equip students with the necessary 21st Century mindset, skill sets and values to navigate life so that they are ready to embrace all the challenges and opportunities that await them.

Finally, despite all the sentiments of gloom and doom that surround us, I choose to remain hopeful. We may be running into funding problems with our School Enhancement Project and we could be hit hard again by another wave of the pandemic. Yet I choose to believe that the pandemic will be over and that we can see each other soon at the Grand Reunion Dinner to celebrate our 170th anniversary. I choose to believe that with corporate efforts we will be able to provide better facilities for our students. I choose to stay positive about the future because I believe that God works in mysterious ways and “He has made everything beautiful in its time”. (Ecclesiastes 3:11)

In Memoriam – Dr. Freddie H. Fu

It was with deepest sadness that we learnt of the passing of alumnus Freddie H. Fu (Class of 1968). Dr. Fu died on the evening of 24th September 2021 in Pittsburgh.



Based at the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center (UPMC), Dr. Freddie Fu was a world-renowned orthopaedic surgeon. He held offices and appointments as David Silver Professor, Chair of the UPMC Department of Orthopaedic Surgery and head team physician for the University of Pittsburgh Athletics Department.

Recognised as a distinguished surgeon, venerable educator and knowledgeable mentor, Dr. Fu received numerous awards and accolades, including Lifetime/Honorary Membership from The European Society of Sports Traumatology, Knee Surgery and Arthroscopy. In 2018, he also received the honor of having the UPMC Sports Medicine Center named after him.

Dr. Fu was committed to giving back to his alma mater. In October 2016, he gladly accepted the invitation from the SPC Alumni Association to speak to our boys in the Alumni Talks Series on sports medicine and his life journey. His insightful words, his illustrious career and his selfless devotion to community service will continue to inspire all Paulines, both past and present.

A bookmark has been tailor-made from the words of wisdom from this speech to remind all Paulines of his insights.

Dr. Fu will be fondly remembered by members of the College community who had the privilege of knowing and learning with and from him. We extend our condolences to his wife, Hilda Pang Fu, their children and grandchildren.

Memorial Service in Honour of Bishop Joseph C. Hoare (1851-1906)

On Saturday 18 September 2021, a memorial service at sea was held to commemorate the Rt. Revd. Joseph Charles Hoare, Bishop of Victoria, Hong Kong. He was the Warden and the 5th Principal of St. Paul's College.

A tragedy happened on the same date 115 years ago, which was 1906, when Bishop Hoare and four students from our College lost their lives during a typhoon on their return boat trip off Castle Peak, Tuen Mun, after the group had preached the gospel for several days there.

Immensely blessed by God's provision of pleasant weather that Saturday, 17 members of the College community sailed along the coast off Tuen Mun in waters near the place where the accident happened.

The group on board included College Council member Terese Wong, Principal Dennis Yuen, College Chaplain Father Shazz Turnquest, the Revd. Kam Fai Ip, Vicar of St. Stephen's Church, the Revd. Francis Yu, Curate of St. Stephen's Church, religious studies teacher Sarah Leung and some student representatives.

They paid homage to Bishop Hoare in a memorial service at sea led by Reverend Ip. Hymns were sung and prayers in tribute to Bishop Hoare were specially offered during the solemn ceremony.

Bishop Hoare left us a legacy of what it means to be in total commitment to God. He was a devout man of God who will be remembered by generations of Paulines with respect and affection.

In Memoriam - Mr. David Leung Chung Por



On 30 September 2021, it was with deepest sadness to hear of the passing of Mr. David Leung Chung Por, our former Principal of St. Paul's College Primary School (SPCPS) from 1969 to 2001.

As a venerable educator and devout Christian, Mr. Leung committed himself to nurturing students with his love and enthusiasm in the St. Paul's family. He was dedicated to Christian fellowship and well-loved by students, teachers, parents and alumni. He served in Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui Echo Office as an English editor from 2007 to 2017, *Echo* is the weekly newspaper of the Province of Hong Kong

Sheng Kung Hui, a popular church publication covering news in the Anglican Church.

He served the community whole-heartedly In 2008, he was one of ten outstanding elderly volunteers to receive the Social Achievement Award. He also took up different positions in St. Paul's Church to contribute to society.

His kindness and selfless devotion to community service will continue to inspire all Paulines to serve and lead others to make a better and more inclusive world.

As the epitome of servant leader, Mr. Leung will be fondly remembered by members of the College community who feel grateful for his influence on his teaching and inspiration. We extend our condolences to his family.

St. Paul's College 170th Anniversary Concert

The 170th Anniversary Concert “**Paul • Our St. Paul’s**” was held at the Grand Theatre of the Hong Kong Cultural Centre at 7:30pm on Sunday, 31 October 2021.

In the past 170 years, generation after generation of Paulines led and served the school and the wider community, following in the footsteps of Christ, our lord, and Saint Paul, the patron saint of the College. It is this tradition of leadership and service that we hope to pass on to this and future generations of Paulines through the musical, *Saint Paul the Apostle*.

The concert featured two musicals: “**2051**” performed by students from our Primary School, and “**Saint Paul the Apostle**”, an original musical performed by talented musicians and singers from the orchestra and choirs of the College. The musical retraced the significant events in the life of Saint Paul for students and members of the College community to commit themselves anew to the Christian values on which the College was founded.

The anniversary concert was an occasion for the SPC community to showcase their God-given talents in performing arts and in organising large-scale events. 170+ St. Paul's Stories — Interviews

Interview with Col. R. Michael Stewart OBE and Frances Stewart

Date: 22 May 2022

Location: Winchester, United Kingdom

On a warm, sunny Sunday afternoon, we visited Col. Michael Stewart, son of Col. Evan Stewart, the College's eighth principal. Michael, who was born in Hong Kong in 1931, recently celebrated his 91st birthday. He shared with us his early childhood, especially of living in Martin House (the College Hostel) at the Glenealy campus and on the top floor of a long-since-demolished building at the Bonham Road campus. He recollected many memories about his father and Hong Kong, especially during the war.

Before we concluded the interview, Michael recommended two books to the College community: *December 1941: Hong Kong Volunteers in Battle* written by his late father, for those interested in Hong Kong's history, and *Children of the Massacre* by two Australian authors, for those curious about the Stewarts' story in China and Hong Kong.

Interview with Mrs. Christine M. Speak

Date: 29 January 2022

Location: Salisbury, United Kingdom

Mrs. Speak is the widow of the Revd. Geoffrey L. Speak, the College's ninth principal. She taught Geography at St. Paul's College. As the pandemic in Britain receded, we visited Mrs. Speak for an in-person interview at her hometown in Southern England. She was very welcoming and greeted us at the railway station in Cantonese, which she had picked up a bit of many years ago. Her Cantonese was more fluent than we expected, as she proudly showed us how she had haggled with stall owners in Sai Ying Pun Market.

In the interview, Mrs. Speak recounted how she met her husband while at the University of Cambridge and how Bishop Hall invited them in the 1950s to embark on a career in Hong Kong,* which marked the start of their journey with St. Paul's. While Mr. Speak left the College in 1967 to found Island School, Mrs. Speak remained as a teacher in St. Paul's before furthering her studies. The couple later retired to the UK, where Mrs. Speak continued her passion in Geography and was active in the Royal Geographical Society.

* Bishop Ronald Owen Hall (1895–1975) was the seventh Bishop of Victoria and later the Bishop of Hong Kong and Macau from 1932 to 1966.

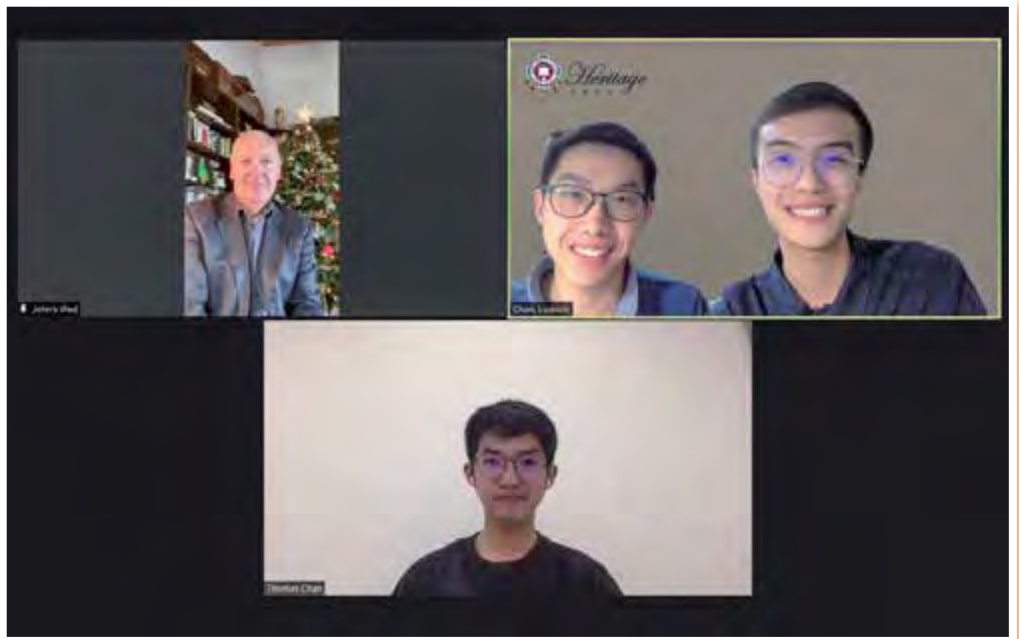
Interview with Dr. John R. Kennard

Our team connected with Dr. Kennard online via conferencing software. He shared his life as the eleventh principal of St. Paul's, from 2006 to 2014. After leaving Hong Kong, he served as Principal of various schools in Europe and in China and recently retired to Australia.

In the interview, he shared his reason for initiating heritage services at St. Paul's Church and St. John's Cathedral for junior form students, which have become part and parcel of students learning the College's origins. He also mentioned the 2011 choir visit to St. Paul's Cathedral in London as a phenomenal occasion to celebrate the College's century-long heritage.

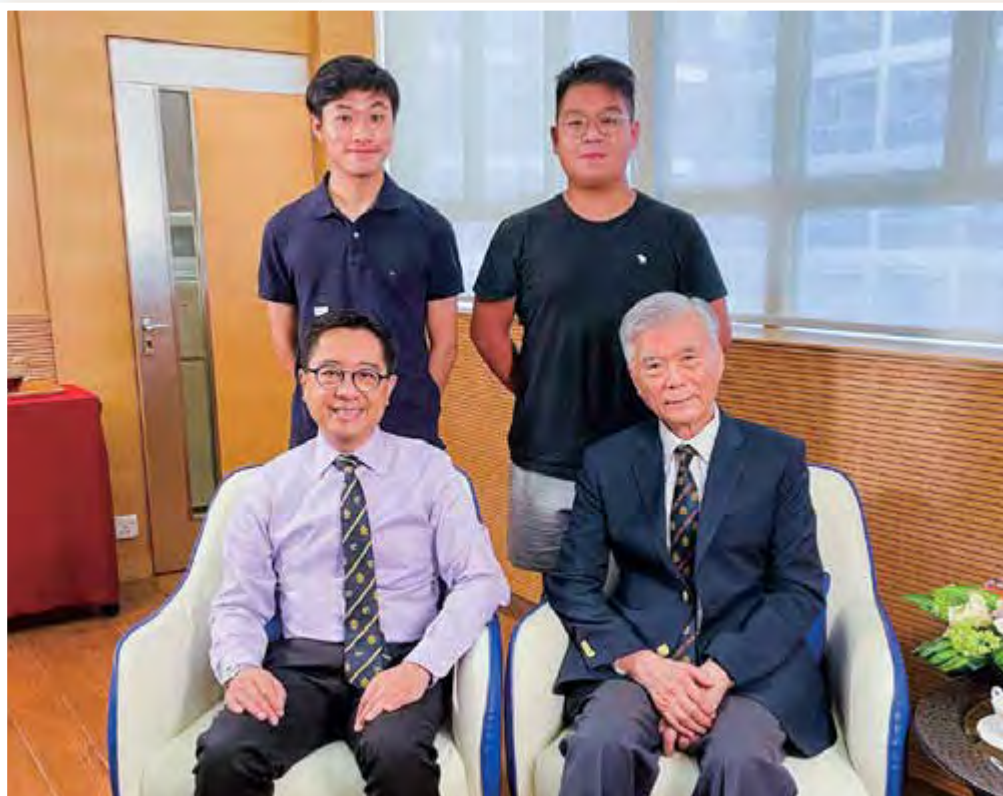
Interview with Mr. Timothy W. H. Ha

The Rubbing of College Name Signage

We are very grateful to the artefact conservator, Dr Karen Fong, a professional in artefact and architecture conservation, who undertook the rubbing of the College name signage at our old campus site in Glenealy, Central.

In July 2021, Dr. Fong worked on high scaffolds and meticulously carried out the rubbing of the stone inscribed with our school name, and also of the Chinese couplet on the vertical slabs on either side of the school name stone.

The new Christian art installation consists of six mosaics and two plaques. It is located in the covered hallway between Stewart Building and South Wing.

On Friday, 7 January, it was a great pleasure and honour for us to have the Most Revd. Andrew Chan, Archbishop and Primate of Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui, conduct the mural blessing ceremony. Among those in attendance were Dr. Arnold Cheng, Chairman of the College Council; Mr. Dennis Yuen, our Principal; Father Shazz Turnquest, our Chaplain; and several guests of honour, Dr. Leung Wing Tai, an alumnus (Class of 1967) and consultant for the mural project; and the mural designer, Ms. Helene Wong, and her husband and mural construction coordinator, Mr. Barry Chan.

According to Ms. Wong, she drew inspiration for the whole mural design from Romans 12:1-2, The two biblical verses are therefore also engraved respectively on the two plaques of the installation. They carry the message of ‘*offering ourselves as a living sacrifice to God*’, which echoes the motif of the mosaics: ‘*The Dedication of Paul to Jesus*’.

We hope that these Christian mosaic murals will be a source of inspiration for all Paulines as they seek to dedicate themselves to doing the good work of God both at school and in the community.

The Meaning and Stories Behind the Campus Mosaic Murals

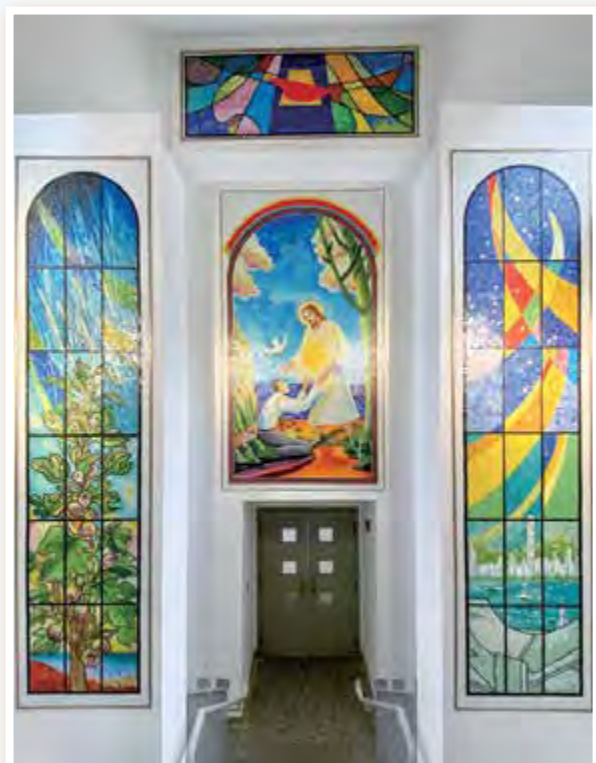
Here are the meanings and stories behind each of the mural designs, as provided by the mural designer, Ms. Helene Wong, our Principal, Mr. Dennis Yuen, and Dr. Leung Wing Tai, consultant for the mural project.

The three vertical murals are evocative of triptych altarpieces, which were popular in churches in medieval times.

According to Ms. Helene Wong, author of the mosaic murals, the various vivid and vibrant colours serve to highlight the diverse and dynamic school life at St. Paul's College.

The covered hallway where the mosaic murals are now exhibited was selected by the Principal. Mr. Yuen comments that the hallway itself resembles a tunnel, which offers a different experience from one end to the other. Ms. Wong is also fond of the designated location. She remarks that the natural light streaming through the windows into the hallway lends a spiritual aura to the murals there.



Dr. Leung Wing Tai, consultant for the mural project, suggested this line based on Psalm 39:7, since God is the very centre of our life and worship.



The Principal suggested putting in layman's terms the biblical phrase from Romans 12:1: '*a living sacrifice to God*', which is the motif of the entire mosaic art installation. He came up with a phrase which is akin to the original: '*a life dedicated to God*', and so it is readily comprehensible by all.



In Christian iconography, the dove (Matthew 3:16) and water (Isaiah 44:3) are both symbols of the Holy Spirit.



This is the smallest of the six mosaics. According to the mural designer, the abstract irregular patterns convey a sense of modernity, which contrasts with the more realistic and conventional style that is employed in the mural triptych underneath.

The scarlet shape in the centre symbolises the sacrificial blood of Jesus.

In Jeremiah 20, the fig tree represents the people of God, and here it represents the student body of the College. As explained by Ms. Helene Wong, the figs on the tree signify the fruits of our students as they live the Christian way of life led by God's calling.

The sky depicted in the mural takes on a rather dark hue and is traversed by some golden streaks. It denotes the storm of life that every one of our students has to go through.



The right mural features the skyline of Hong Kong Island while depicting several iconic landmarks on both sides of Victoria Harbour. It is closely associated with the left mural in that both St. Paul's College and its students share the same divine calling to 'bear fruit' by serving the local community.

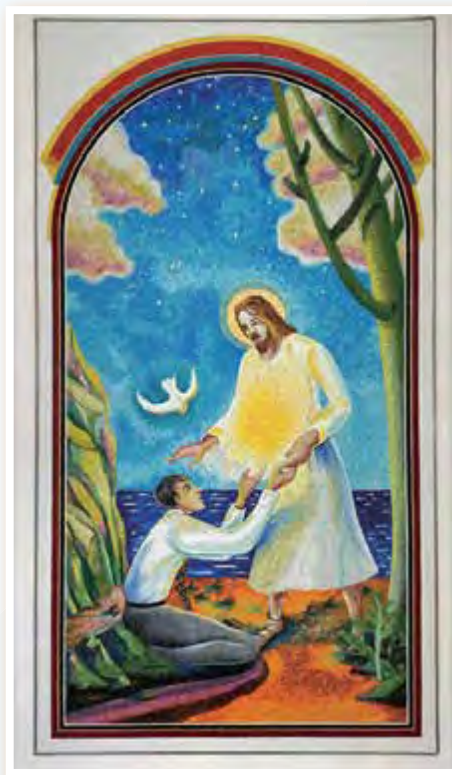


The centrepiece of the mosaic triptych prominently features a student in College uniform kneeling at the foot of Jesus in a humble act of submission and dedication to Him.

In the mural, the Lord is clad in radiant raiment, manifesting the glory of His divine majesty. A dove is descending over the student, which represents God's grace and blessing showering down upon our students who respond to God's calling and dedicate their lives to Jesus Christ.

Ms. Wong shared an amazing story about the student portrayed in the mural. During a site visit to the hallway designated for the murals, she happened to run into a student walking down the stairs next to it. She jumped at the opportunity and asked if she could take a photo of him kneeling down. Much to her delight and surprise, the boy agreed. He knelt down without hesitation – and this prompt act of submission led to the creation of this awe-inspiring mural about sacrifice and dedication to God.

Also noteworthy is the shape of the central mural. It resembles an arched door frame. The curved part at the top is purposely lined with red tiles, which allude to the blood of a sacrificial lamb sprinkled on the door frame before the Tenth Plague in Exodus 12:1-20. It foreshadows the sacrificial blood of Jesus Christ for the redemption and salvation of mankind.



170th Anniversary - St. Paul's College Alumni Choir Fundraising Concert – “MAGNIFICENT 170”

St. Paul's College held the St. Paul's College Alumni Choir Fund Raising Concert – “MAGNIFICENT 170” at the Hong Kong City Hall on Tuesday, 14 December 2021. Many celebrities and alumni participated in the chorus to celebrate the 170th anniversary of their alma mater. Executive Council member Joseph Yam Chi-kwong, former President of the Legislative Council Jasper Tsang Yok-sing, National People's Congress Deputy Ma Ho-fai, and the Executive Chairman of the Teochew International Federation Ian Chan Yau-nam, etc., and more than 100 alumni chorused. Young alumni who are active in the music industry, including Alan Po, and Hansun and Van from Nowhere boys, performed together with nearly 300 people from the choir of primary and secondary school students from St. Paul's College and the Diocesan Graduate Singers.



Yam Chi-kwong said it was such a rare opportunity, since his graduation in 1967, to gather nearly 30 alumni graduated in the 1960s for a school performance with time going by so fast. He added that his two-year advanced level studies at St. Paul's College was a once-in-a-lifetime experience. Although he also participated in sports activities such as hiking, it was the singing of the choir that touched his heart. The alumnus participates in singing and poetry reading from time to time through video conferences.

Tsang Yok-sing said that the choir of St. Paul's College has always been extraordinary, and he hopes that more alumni will join the alumni choir in the future. The alumni's award-winning songs were specially picked for this performance.

LEE JASPER YEE JING AND YEUNG LOK HEI, HONG KONG SCHOLARSHIP FOR EXCELLENCE SCHEME AWARDEES

Lee Jasper Yee Jing and Yeung Lok Hei, two of our Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education (HKDSE) graduates in 2021/2022, have been awarded a scholarship of HK\$300,000 per annum through the Hong Kong Scholarship for Excellence Scheme (HKSES) to pursue a Bachelor of Arts in Natural Sciences (Biological) degree at University of Cambridge and a Bachelor of Music at the Royal College of Music respectively.

HONG KONG DIPLOMA OF SECONDARY EDUCATION

85.5% of our 2021 HKDSE graduates met the general entrance requirements (i.e. "33222" in the four core subjects and one elective) for JUPAS undergraduate programmes. On average, our students attained Level 5 or above in 3.4 subjects. The Class of 2021 achieved outstandingly.

Our highest scorer, Kwong Ho To, achieved Level 5*** in 7 subjects (including M1 in Mathematics Extended Part Module) and Level 5* in one other subject he took in 2021 HKDSE.

STEM+E Competition 2022

The *STEM+E Competition 2022*, an inspiring contest jointly organised by the STEM+E Consortium, Cyberport and Hong Kong Science and Technology Parks Corporation (HKSTP), aims to prepare students for an ever-changing world by nurturing their creativity and problem-solving skills. More than 400 students from over 80 secondary schools took part in the *STEM+E Competition 2022*.

Under the guidance of start-ups from Cyberport and HKSTP as well as business leaders, the students formed groups to tackle social concerns such as “Waste Reduction and Management” and “Health and Well-being” by leveraging innovative technologies.

The final contest was held at Cyberport on 28 May 2022, with the finalists presenting their business plans to the judging panel both online and in person.

The competition concluded on 18 June 2022 with an award presentation ceremony for the winning students.

Two SPC representatives - Cheng Sze Ming from Class 4A and Lung Tin Chak Aaron from Class 4C were awarded with the MVP (Most Valuable Player) Award. They have gained valuable experiences in making a business plan as a start-up company guided by different business leaders. They also had a chance to cooperate with other students from other schools.



SUMMER PROGRAMME

With the resounding success of the first Summer Programme in 2021, the College launched its first Summer Programme again in July 2021, aiming at providing students with ample opportunity to develop their potential and extend their repertoire of skills.

After long periods of disruptions to in-person classes due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the face-to-face summer courses provided our students with a diverse array of interactive hands-on activities, which are conducive to knowledge acquisition, generic skills development and character building.

JOINT SCHOOL COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECT – FLARE 22

Flare, our annual joint school community service event, was successfully held via Zoom on 14 April 2022. The aim of the event was to raise public awareness of the needs of the underprivileged and connect students with the community. Our students together with those from Aberdeen Baptist Lui Ming Choi College, Sacred Heart Canossian College and St. Stephen's Girls' College participated in the event.

With “Understanding the Visually Impaired around the Globe” as the theme, *Flare22* provided students with opportunities to examine social issues related to the visually impaired.

We were delighted to have Mr. Mok Kim-wing, M.H., Founder of the Fearless Dragons Running Club and Chief Executive of the Hong Kong Network for the Promotion of Inclusive Society (HKNPIS), as our keynote speaker during the youth conference. After Mr. Mok delivered the keynote speech, students from participating schools presented their research findings to the attendees. They also enjoyed a *Kahoot!* quiz, which consolidated learning.

Continuing the tradition of having a handprint activity, the event included an activity in which the participants were asked to make their handprint and send the image to the organisers. The images gathered were then arranged to form the word “FLARE22” on a banner.

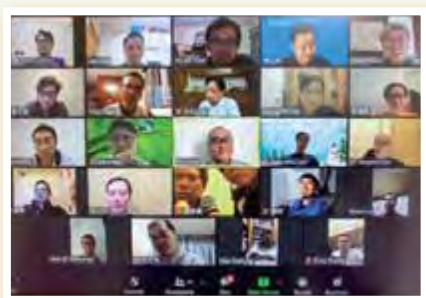

This year, the Foundation is closely involved in strategic planning and the execution of a Public Relations and Communications campaign that will integrate the projection of our brand identity while planning the celebration activities for our 170th Anniversary. The first activity is the Anniversary kick-off ceremony in October 2021 during which the launch of the new Alumni Endowment Fund was announced.

The Foundation also supports the effort of the College to collaborate with Asia Society Hong Kong Centre to organise a series of webinars on preparing our youth for future challenges and opportunities in Technological Innovation, Healthcare, Work and Education, and Climate Change. Four webcast seminars, all moderated by our alumni, bring together ten distinguished speakers, including renowned academics, industry leaders and SPC alumni, from relevant fields.

The Foundation introduces the concept of 'Annual Giving' and invites donations to support special projects of the school such as subsidies to activities in the areas of sports, music, science or other fields. Every time you give, you would have provided the much-needed support to the college. Besides making general donations, another way to support Annual Giving is to buy souvenirs produced by the Foundation. An e-Shop has begun operation in September 2021 to sell souvenirs including those designed especially for 170th Anniversary. I must express our appreciation to our alumnus from Class of 1993, Mr. Justin Chan, for his effort and support towards the e-Shop webpage development.

Our Executive Committee members and members from the eight Committees would work together to ensure the smooth operation of the Foundation and make sure that all funds raised will be allocated through the proper channels and for designated purposes.

Message from Convenor of the Fundraising Committee



St. Paul's College began its 170th Anniversary Celebration in 2021. At the same time, two major programs with significant implications to the school's development were initiated: the Campus Enhancement Project, which that will transform the school premises with additional space and facilities with standards that meet modern learning requirements, and the Endowment Fund, which allows capable students with less privileged backgrounds to enjoy their education at St. Paul's. Both projects require major financial support and contribution from everyone in our community, all of which are essential to the realisation of our vision.

After the successful completion of phase one of the Enhancement Project, phase two commenced in April 2021 after 50 million dollars had been raised. Upon completion, we will see an additional 1300 sq. m. of floor area at the New Multi-purpose Main Entrance Hall, an indoor swimming pool and a state-of-the-art library. To date 17 million has been spent on preparing the foundation for construction, which is scheduled to finish in June this year. The total fund we need to raise is HK\$70 million before the end of 2024.

Another milestone program is the establishment of an Alumni Endowment Fund. It was named Alumni because it was initiated by alumni who treasured the time they spent at St. Paul's where they learned the spirit of inclusiveness through a student body of diverse backgrounds. The Endowment Fund would be used to support qualified students with lesser means so that they would not be denied admission due to financial constraints. To kick start the Endowment Fund, an alumnus pledged a matching fund of HK\$30 million to challenge more alumni to join the effort.

St. Paul's is committed to providing an education to inspire students to follow in the footsteps of their forefathers to serve society. The School will continuously explore ways to better prepare them to face a fast changing and exciting world. The seminar series organised by the school was an activity of such nature. It provided a forum for us and educators of HK to engage in a meaningful dialogue that is beneficial to students in Hong Kong at large.

Once again, let me appeal to you for your full support to help St. Paul's realise its vision.

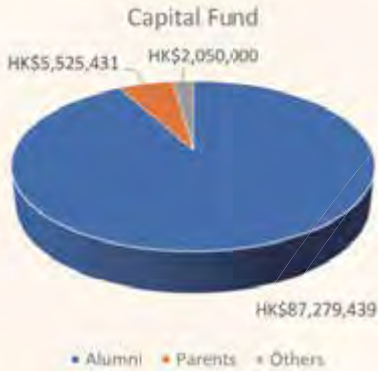

In 2019, St. Paul's College began its second enhancement of the campus to meet the needs of the 21st Century education.

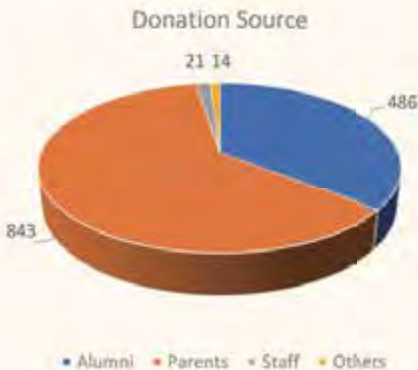
The objective of Capital Fund is to finance the School Enhancement Project, to augment the learning environment and facilities of the school premises for our students.



Endowment Fund

In parallel with campus enhancement, St. Paul's College has pledged to assist qualified students who are financially constrained. The College has a proud tradition of welcoming students from a wide spectrum of family backgrounds, which creates an environment for students to experience diversity.

The Endowment Fund is set up to allow St. Paul's College to open its doors to all students regardless of their backgrounds.



Capital Fund

To commemorate the kick-start of Phase Two of the School Enhancement Project, the Fundraising Committee hosted an appreciation dinner on 11 September 2021 at the China Club to honour our major donors in 2019-2021.

This was the first time for us to meet our donors physically since the outbreak of the COVID-19 in 2019. The event was conducted under the regulation of the Prevention and Control of Disease.

During the dinner, we presented Certificates of Appreciation to our Major Donors whose contribution would be commemorated by the naming of a classroom, function/resource room or other school facilities during the two years. 15 major donors and class representatives joined the dinner with their spouses and it was a successful and meaningful dinner to us.





Two generous donations of HK\$5 million and HK\$2.5 million came from two alumni who would like to remain anonymous.

Class of 1969 also initiated a Class Gift Campaign after their visit to the campus in the sharing session last year and they raised HK\$1 million towards the naming of Classroom 5E. The Class of 1996 made their pledge at their 25th Anniversary targeting HK\$1 million for the naming of The Shop at the New Entrance.

The Alumni Choir organised “The Magnificent 170’ Concert” on 14 Decemebr 2021 at the Hong Kong City Hall. Alumni spanning 70 years gathered for the strongest performance ever, epitomising the theme of the 170th anniversary, “Celebrate Our Heritage. Build Our Future” for the 170th anniversary. The Concert successfully raised over 1 million dollars for the School Enhancement Project.



Endowment Fund

The College announced the establishment of a new Alumni Endowment Fund for Scholarships at the luncheon of the 170th Anniversary kick-off ceremony on 21 October 2021.

An Endowment Fund, initiated by a group of alumni, was launched with the belief that no capable students should be denied admission to St. Paul's College due to their financial considerations. To take the first step to move the Fund forward, an alumnus pledged a seeding fund of HK\$30 million, a one-to-one matching gift. The establishment of the Endowment Fund is monumental to the school's development. It will provide opportunities to students from all backgrounds, creating a healthy environment for the students to mature in. During lunch, a group of alumni spontaneously donated HK\$850k and together with the matching fund raised the gift to be HK\$1.7 million.



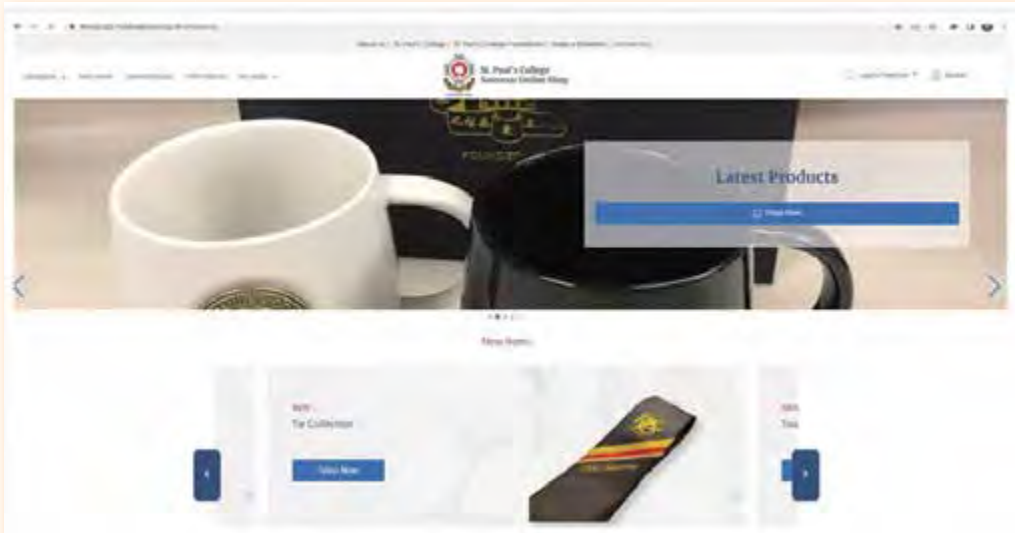
General Fund

The St. Paul's College Foundation was officially inaugurated on 16 October, 2008.

We hope to ensure that our boys are given every opportunity to reach their full potential in a first-class learning environment. Funds raised will support a number of projects including the relocation of the Primary School, the global classroom, service projects, student scholarships and e-learning. Throughout the years, our alumni have contributed both by making donations or purchases of the much-needed resources to the school.

E-shop

The Foundation has also been the supplier of souvenirs and school garments which served as a continuous source of income. With the launch of the E-shop in the last quarter of 2021, the customers and supporters of the College can purchase souvenirs and garments online and receive door-to-door delivery. It gives another reason for donors to engage beyond regular donations and fundraising campaigns. With the celebration of the 170th Anniversary, we hope to add unique anniversary souvenirs to our collection and generate additional income to our fund. These souvenirs will be the symbol of the bonding among members of the school community, something money cannot buy.



Other Projects

PR support for 170th Anniversary seminars

To enhance the academic ambience of St. Paul's College, the Public Relations and Communication Committee members proposed that the College organise the 170th Anniversary Seminar Series in collaboration with Asia Society Hong Kong Centre (ASHK). With the aim of championing the theme "Build Our Future", the Seminar Series would bring hope and opportunities to the next generation and prepare our youth for the future.

We invited renowned alumni and distinguished scholars to present their expertise in the areas of technological innovation, healthcare, work and education, as well as climate change.

This was the first time for ASHK to work in collaboration with a local secondary school in organising a series of seminars for the community at large to enlighten students with forward-looking topics to better prepare them for the future. The webinars offered students valuable learning experience and insight into major trends, pressing issues, challenges and incredible opportunities. The Plenary Session on 7 May at ASHK Centre brought together ten eminent speakers across a broad range of sectors to shed light on future trends in their domains and share their views on ways in which various stakeholders can get involved to help build a better learning environment and a brighter future for our youth.

The 170th Anniversary Seminar Series was supported by the Foundation and we also sponsored the media partnership to publicise the event to the public and invited students, parents and teachers from other schools to join the seminars.
